


Creating a Family of Learners!

- Dual Enrollment for middle and high school students
- Non-Credit courses for parents and community members
- Student and family orientations
- K-12 and community partnership



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The Steps Towards Community Engagement and Empowerment



Hartnell College



Traditional Family Engagement Strategies*

- Bound by school walls
- Heavily geared towards parents
- Assumes all families feel welcomed/included at schools

*It is important to note that traditional models need not be fully abandoned, rather recognizing the limitations of such models can lead to systemic change

Non-Traditional Family Engagement Strategies

- Engaging with Community Based Organizations (CBOs)
- Alternative engagement sites (off-site, including at the college site)
- Engaging with systematically excluded populations
 - Indigenous and African American students
- Co-creating content/materials as informed by the CBO
 - Language & images
 - Deeper dive into specific questions/concerns
 - Emphasis on community cultural wealth
